

Staffing Updates	
Transfers:	Two members of the Red Lake Detachment transferred out during Q1. There vacant positions have been identified to NWR for recruit or EPO prioritization. Expected arrival of replacements is estimated October 2023.

#### **In Car Cameras**

Each front line vehicle has been equipped with ICCs which also incorporates Automated License Plate Recognition (ALPR). ICCs are the precursor to body worn cameras (BWC).

#### Intelligence Lead Policing - Crime Abatement Strategy (ILP-CAS)

Renewed focus on warrant identification and execution in addition to holding offenders accountable while on judicial interim release. OPP, OACP, CACP, and Police Associations across Canada are advocating for bail reform changes resulting from the murder of OPP Constable Greg Pierzchala.

#### Service Delivery Model

The Service Delivery Model has been completed for the Red Lake/Ear Falls/Pikangikum Detachments. After evaluation we have brought forward a variance advocating for additional supervisory positions that will produce efficiency in command and control specifically for Red Lake and Pikangikum Detachments.
