

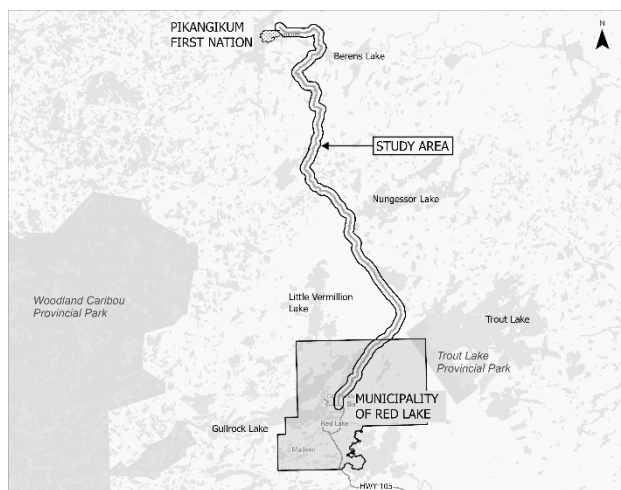
Red Lake and Pikangikum First Nation New Landfill Comprehensive Environmental Assessment Notice of Submission of Draft Terms of Reference

The Study

The Municipality of Red Lake, in collaboration with Pikangikum First Nation, has initiated a Comprehensive Environmental Assessment to identify a site for the potential development of a new landfill facility to serve both communities. A new landfill may be located at a site along the Nungesser Road between the two communities. A possible site will be assessed as part of the study.

The Process

The first step in the EA process is the preparation of the Terms of Reference, setting out the parameters of the study. As part of the planning process for the Red Lake and Pikangikum First Nation New Landfill Comprehensive Environmental Assessment, a Terms of Reference is being issued for public and agency review as required under the *Environmental Assessment Act*. If approved, the terms of reference will serve as a framework for the preparation and review of the environmental assessment for the proposed undertaking.

Your written comments about the terms of reference must be received before the 45-day comment period closure on **September 11th, 2026**. All comments must be submitted to:
